Grants Available For Cabarrus County Nonprofits *The Cabarrus County Community Foundation Now Accepting Applications*

September 2, 2009– The Cabarrus County Community Foundation is currently accepting applications from nonprofit organizations for its 2009 Grants Program. Grants will be made to support the 2008 Cabarrus County Community Needs Assessment focusing specifically on three key issues and needs: Workforce Development, Dropout Prevention and Literacy and Healthcare Affordability - Screening and Prevention. Proposals must fall within one of these three areas to be considered.

Applicants must be nonprofit, tax-exempt organizations serving Cabarrus County citizens. Grants do not cover book publication, conferences, endowment funds, individual needs or operating budgets beyond the seed level.
