Stanly County Community Foundation Recognizes Grantees *Twelve Stanly County nonprofit agencies receive charitable funding*

September 19, 2016 (Albemarle, N.C.) – Representatives from local nonprofit organizations that received grants from the Stanly County Community Foundation were honored today at a reception held at the Albemarle City Hall.

The event was recorded by and will be featured on Stanly Community College Television (SCC-TV Channel 21). This provided an opportunity for the nonprofit organizations to share information about their organization with the community.

Established in 1999, the Stanly County Community Foundation is committed to helping individuals and families reach their philanthropic goals through quality charitable giving services. The community foundation helps local nonprofits secure their futures through endowments and the establishment of charitable giving programs. The foundation also addresses a broad range of changing local needs through its grantmaking program, awarding grants annually to local area nonprofits.

The Foundation distributed grants totaling \$30,500 to twelve Stanly area nonprofit organizations:

- **\$2,500 to Bridge to Recovery** for support of individuals struggling with addiction.
- **\$1,200 to Crisis Assistance Fund** for its Transportation Assistance Program.
- **\$3,900 to GHA Autism Supports** to the expansion of its creative arts program.
- **\$2,500 to Girl Scouts, Hornets' Nest Council** for Girls Scouts Program in underserved areas.
- **\$500 to Pfeiffer University** for the Community Hunger Relief Garden
- **\$2,500 to Ronald McDonald House of Charlotte** for its Stanly County Families Fund.
- **\$3,000 to Special Olympics** for its Stanly County Program Expansion.
- **\$1,000 to Stanly Regional Medical Center Foundation** for its Passport to Summertime Program.
- **\$4,000 to Stanly Community Christian Ministry** for its Food Preservation Improvement Program.
- **\$5,000 to Stanly County Family YMCA** for its Open Doors Scholarship Program.
- **\$2,500 to Stanly County Partnership for Children** for its Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program.
- **\$1,900 to Stanly County Senior Services** for the purchase of picnic tables for the planned outdoor area.
