### LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT & BOARD CHAIR

In 2016, FFTC launched a number of exciting enhancements, including online fund statements and expanded investment offerings.

Your spirit of philanthropy has been felt throughout our community over the past year as your generosity continues to make a meaningful difference in our region.

Charitable assets rose to nearly \$1.75 billion in 2015, with fundholders contributing \$360 million to funds managed by FFTC. The impact of this giving is astounding. Last year alone, our fundholders awarded grants totaling \$284 million to benefit a variety of worthy causes. In addition, our donors pledged more than \$133 million in planned gifts in 2015, increasing our pipeline to more than \$545 million, ensuring a vibrant future for our region's nonprofits for generations to come.

To better serve our generous fundholders, FFTC launched several exciting enhancements in 2016, including online fund statements, expanded investment offerings and reduced pricing for standard service funds.

By partnering with FFTC, our donors make an even bigger difference in our region. Our flagship program, the Robinson Center for Civic Leadership, continues to address our community's greatest challenges and opportunities. Of particular note:

- ► The Charlotte Mecklenburg Opportunity Task Force continues its work toward developing recommendations for increasing economic opportunity for all members of our community.
- Project L.I.F.T. announced an impressive increase in on-time graduation rates at West Charlotte High School from 54 percent in 2011 to 86 percent in 2016. While these numbers indicate we're heading in the

- right direction, there is still work to do toward our overall goal of ensuring students are ready for college and careers.
- Fundraising for the Carolina Theatre at Belk Place draws ever closer to its goal, with more than \$38 million committed to date. The project is slated to break ground soon.
- ► The North Tryon Vision Plan was released in 2016, laying the groundwork for re-energizing this vital corridor in uptown Charlotte.

This is just a glimpse of the extraordinary leadership and impact we've witnessed over the past year. Thank you to all of our partners, donors and friends for their hard work and vision of the future, and especially for their generosity and commitment to our community.


