Grants Available: Cabarrus County Community Foundation Now Accepting Applications from Nonprofits

CONCORD, N.C. – The Cabarrus County Community Foundation is currently accepting applications for its 2021 grant program. Eligible organizations include 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations, congregations, governmental and educational institutions.

Priority will be given to projects and programs that address arts and culture, education, the environment, health or housing. All proposed projects and programs must serve residents of Cabarrus County. Award amounts will be determined based on the merits of the project, and previous awards have ranged from \$1,000 to \$10,000.

To begin the application process, visit fftcgrants.communityforce.com and select “Cabarrus County Community Foundation” to access the online application. Returning applicant organizations can log in to the Online Grants Center using their previously established ID and password. First-time applicant organizations can create a new account.

Completed applications must be submitted online **by noon on Friday, Oct. 8**. The online application closes promptly at 12 p.m. and will not accept late submissions.
