Charlotte Mecklenburg Community Foundation awards more than \$672,000 to 37 local nonprofits addressing economic mobility

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The <u>Charlotte Mecklenburg Community Foundation</u> (CMCF) recently awarded \$672,530 to 37 local nonprofits that support youth from cradle to career, provide family stability, build social capital and encourage civic engagement.

This grant program aligns with the recommendations of the <u>Charlotte Mecklenburg Opportunity Task Force Report</u> (March 2017) and Leading on Opportunity's <u>Opportunity Compass</u>. Launched in 2022, the Opportunity Compass is a tool that provides a shared language for the key determinants of economic mobility and establishes a baseline for future progress for our community. These recent grants reflect CMCF's continued investment in fostering a landscape of economic opportunity for all current and future residents of Mecklenburg County, N.C.

To date, the Charlotte Mecklenburg Community Foundation has provided more than \$35 million in grant awards.
